

## INTRODUCTION

The Boreas river is a tributary of the Hudson river, in New York state. The section described here runs from Blue Ridge Road (84) to route 28N.

## FACT SHEET

Length : 6.5 mi (10 km)

Difficulty: class II-III

## DESCRIPTION

Wild and scenic section of the Adirondacks.

### First half

The first half starts with a few rapids, the last class 2/3 being fairly steep. The next 2.5 miles are quiet, and ends at the remnants of a dam that make a class 2/3. At low water level, it was crowded and almost impassable. With more water it should be nicer.

### Second half

The second half of the section is more sustained, with a more difficult stretch. At all times, the river is far from any road.

### Walk along the Lower Boreas from the take-out

From the take-out, a trail on the left bank follows the river downstream and allows to see a few difficult rapids of the next section (Lower Boreas). This next section has a reputation of being reserved to very experienced boaters.
